Welcome to Term 2! In Foundation, students have had a terrific start to the term and have jumped straight back into learning.

Reading

During Reading this term, Foundation students are learning to sound out unknown words. Students have

been using their sounds knowledge they have learnt in class to help them to sound out unknown words. Students have already begun to take home readers to practise their reading at home.

Students during the term, will also be learning some other reading strategies. These include looking at the word and using the picture for clues and pointing to each word as they read to make sure they have read the correct number of words on the page.





<u>Writing</u>

In Writing, Foundation students are continuing to say, recognise and write the sounds of the Alphabet. During the term, Foundation students have also been learning how to spell and read some high frequency words.



Maths

In Maths, students have been learning to count to 10 and to 20. Students have been making, writing, and counting objects. Students in Maths have also been learning about Patterns. Students have been busy creating and designing their Patterns in class using shapes.



Social Development

As part of our social development, students in Foundation have been having some free play in the afternoon. This has been a great opportunity for students to practise and work on their social skills. Some social skills that students have been working on revolves around working cooperatively as a team, solving problems when conflict occurs and learning how to share.


Who Let the Gods Out by Maz Evan
