



#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### **Dear Parents and Carers**

#### **2024 PREP INFORMATION EVENING**

Our 2024 Prep information evening will be held this Wednesday evening from 7pm in the BER building. We are looking forward to meeting potential 2024 families as well as those families who already have children here at Drouin South Primary School. The evening will cover a number of topics relating to starting school and will be presented by our teachers including teacher from our Junior Team.

#### **BIG FREEZE**

Drouin South Primary School's Student Representative Council have decided to raise money for research into Motor Neurone Disease. Motor Neurone Disease (MND) is the name given to a group of diseases in which the nerve cells (neurons) that control the muscles degenerate and die. MND is a slowly progressive disease in that it gets steadily worse over time. There is neither cure nor prevention for MND at this time but worldwide research is providing encouraging results. In most cases intellect and memory are not affected by MND, nor are the senses of sight, hearing, taste, smell and sensation.

Our Big Freeze activities planned for last Friday were postponed and will now be held this Friday 16th June during lunch time. Slushies will be on sale for \$3 each.

#### **CURRICULUM DAY MONDAY 19th JUNE—BERRY ST TRAINING**

Next Monday will be a pupil free day as all staff at Drouin South Primary School participate in Day 1 of Berry Street Education training. The Berry St Education program is a 4 day program that staff will be trained in over 2023 and 2024.

The training has been made possible through Department of Education Mental health Funding to schools.

Throughout the program, teachers and support staff will learn how to help students meet their own learning needs by:

- understanding the benefits of trauma-informed teaching on child development and ability to learn
- creating a supportive and trauma-informed positive education classroom
- bolstering student-teacher relationships
- applying positive relational classroom behaviour management strategies
- instilling strengths-based practices across the school.

Teachers and support staff at DSPS will learn strategies to keep students engaged and how to support them to have an improved capacity for school achievement.


#### A message from our Chaplain.....

But, "If children live with tolerance, they learn to be patient."







#### Fees

Daily fee of \$76

Fee after max CCS\* \$15.20 per day

Incursion day fee of \$94

Fee after max CCS\* \$20.00

The additional cost of \$18 for incursion days will be charged per child even if your child doesn't participate.

\* The amount of CCS you can get depends on your circumstances and the hourly rate cap set by the Government. To find out if you are eligible, simply log into your MyGov and complete your CCS Assessment.

Please note: Child/ren must attend the first and last day of care in order to receive CCS.

#### How to book

- 2. Complete Enrolment, Booking and Payment form

NOTE If your child has a medical condition they can only attend the Holiday Program if the Action Plan, Risk Minimisation Plan and Communication have been completed and submitted prior to attendance. Any medication associated with the action plans must be brought to the program each day they attend. If medication is not supplied on the day, the child may not attend the program. This rule applies for all diagnosed medical conditions.

#### Absences

All bookings are charged prior to attendance. This secures your child's spot in the Holiday Program. Staffing is based on attendance. If your child is sick or not attending a booked session, please call and notify the program before 8.30am. Please review the cancellation policy with regards to if a credit can be applied, as in some instances credit may not be able to be applied.

#### Age to attend

To qualify for enrolment in Windermere's Holiday Program children must be attending primary school (in that year).

#### Priority of access

Windermere's Holiday Program is offered to the general community.

Priority of Access will be given to:

- Children at risk of serious abuse or neglect and families in crisis.
- 2. Children of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families.
- Children attending the host school and other Windermere OSHC Schools.
- 4. Children residing within the LGA.

#### Your safety and COVID-19

#### Please help us keep the program safe by:

Keeping any children who are sick at home, if anyone in your household is unwell and awaiting a COVID test result we ask you keep children at home (even if they are not displaying any symptoms). The children/child can attend the program once a negative test result has been confirmed and if they have a booking.

#### We will keep you COVID safe by:

We have developed COVIDSafe plan and risk assessment that encourages social distancing of staff, consistent staffing where possible, increased cleaning and disinfecting and signing children in and out of the program.
