
### A message from our Chaplain.....



### The circulatory system



### The respiratory system


The respiratory system is the system that keeps us breathing and helps us stay alive. Oxygen goes through the mouth or nose down the trachea then into the bronchial then through the bronchial tubes then goes back out the way it came in. Asthma can affect your breathing. You get it when you are in the cold air or doing sports. How do you know when you have asthma? You will know when you have asthma when your airways get tight. Asthma can be life threatening. When you breathe in your diaphragm contracts and pulls air into your lungs and when you breathe out it goes into its normal position.

### The heart

The heart is a control room,watching over the body,caring for them. Our hearts guide our blood by pumping them though the atrium and ventricles sending them to the lungs and all around our body.

### Alveoli

The **alveoli** are tiny sacs of air at the end of each **bronchial tube** capturing the air before it makes the journey back out, running up the bronchial tubes, passing up by the trachea rewinding back through the sinus and out the nose or mouth. The alveoli are so small tiny; **microscopic** even but they play a very important role and it is vital that they keep healthy throughout life.


### The Lungs

As the air goes into the lungs, it goes through a tree-like structure called the bronchial trees. The air then moves to the bronchiole and into the alveoli. There, the oxygen gets transported away and the carbon dioxide comes into the air, meaning when you breathe out the air takes the carbon dioxide and pushes it out of the lungs and out of the mouth.

### Bone marrow

Did you know you have bone marrow just like a juicy lamb shank? Bone marrow is one of the most important living organisms. What does your bone marrow do? Your bone marrow produces more brand new blood cells and brand new blood cells are very important because when your old blood cells have been there for a long time they start to deform into different shapes and that can affect your blood flow so new blood cells are very important. Bone marrow, a squishy substance, can only be found in your bones and that is why it is called bone marrow and you have miniscule holes in your bone to let veins get in and out.

### The Circulatory System

The circulatory system is your arteries, blood, veins and the most important, the heart, a life saver. The circulatory system is made up of blood vessels. That carries blood away and towards the heart. The arteries carry blood away from the heart and the veins bring blood back to the heart. ### Macca's Makeover by Matt Congran


