
#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### **Dear Parents and Carers**

#### **Supervision Hours**

Parents are reminded that students are supervised at school between the hours of 8.45am and 3.30pm.

It is important that students arrive at school no earlier than 8.45am as they are unsupervised. An Out of School Hours Care service operates within the school to provide care for students who need to arrive at school earlier than 8.45am or need to remain after 3.30pm. Our teachers have been developing our knowledge about the Science of Learning and Reading. The science of reading refers to a body of evidence that encompasses multi-disciplinary knowledge from education, linguistics, cognitive psychology, special education and neuroscience. The science of reading looks at the essential cognitive processes for competent reading and describes how reading develops in both typical and atypical readers. These studies have revealed a great deal about how we learn to read, what goes wrong when students **don't** learn, and the instructional strategies that facilitate the cognitive processes required for reading.

The Science of Learning is the evidence body that exists about how humans learn and the most effective teaching strategies that can be implemented to ensure learning is optimised. (continued)



#### Science of Learning and Science of Reading (continued)

Yesterday several members of our staff participated in a regional training day involving many Gippsland schools between Cowes and Sale.



The day was facilitated by Dr Nathaniel Swain. Dr Swain is a teacher and a Senior Lecturer at La Trobe University.

Throughout the day, participants were introduced to the latest evidence and research on the best and most effective ways to teach reading and to engage students in learning. One of the key drivers for the day was to look at strategies that helps students to process information in their working memory and to transfer this to long term memory. In order to be an effective learner, our concepts and knowledge must be stored in long term memory otherwise it is lost and forgotten!



Our teachers at Drouin South Primary School have already begun trialling some of these strategies such as the Daily Review which is a fast paced part of a lesson that revises past learnings and aims for students to store and retrieve the important parts of learning.

We have also commenced work of building a knowledge base through the use of core units of work that focus on interesting topics whilst practising the skills vital to being effective readers and writers.





This week's Dr Seuss inspired thought is a good one when we are feeling like we can't cope.







As a Level 1 book, this has a simple story structure, a variety of high-frequency words and no more than three sentences per page.


