






Abbey W: For her continuous determination, focus and hard work, especially during assessment time. Great effort Abbey!!

Last night I had the opportunity to enjoy a fantastic display of artwork completed by all of our students throughout the year.


The creativity, colour, skill and variety of examples on display left me totally amazed and extremely proud of the efforts of all students.








A message from our Chaplain.....

News from 5/6A






Prism
