

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Parents and Carers

Reading Fluency

The idea of **reading fluency** seems relatively straightforward. We know what it sounds like when a child can read fluently. A fluent reader is reading accurately, at a good pace, and with appropriate expression. Their reading appears effortless and natural. However, fluent reading requires mastering a complex set of interacting skills and knowledge that does not come easily to all children.

When they are reading fluently, children are better able to understand what they are reading. Fluency has a very strong relationship with reading comprehension and that is why it is so important to include evidence-based fluency instruction in reading lessons.

The National Literacy Learning Progression in the <u>Australian Curriculum</u> describes fluency as:

"how a student becomes increasingly faster, smoother, more accurate and expressive in their reading aloud of progressively complex print texts. At higher levels of the progression, students demonstrate comprehension of a text through confident use of intonation, pausing, accuracy and pace" (Australian Curriculum Assessment and Reporting Authority, n.d.)."

Text or passage reading fluency is generally defined as having three components: accuracy, rate, and expression (or prosody). Children have poor text reading fluency if they read many words of a passage incorrectly, if they read slowly and with obvious effort, or if they read in a stilted or robotic way.

Teachers at Drouin South will use a number of strategies in classrooms to improve students' fluency. These strategies may include:

- Repeated readings of a carefully selected passage
- Choral reading (reading aloud together)
- Echo Reading (read after me)
- Paired/Partner reading
- Reader's Theatre


..... This beautiful picture book also features Cammeraygal language, with assistance from the

The additional cost of \$18 for incursion days will be charged per child even if your child doesn't

* The amount of CCS you can get depends on your circumstances and the hourly rate cap set by the Government. To find out if you are eligible simply log into your MyGov and complete your CCS

Please note: Child/ren must attend the first and last day of care in order to receive CCS.

How to book

- 1. Read through fee and cancelation policy
- 2. Complete Enrolment, Booking and Payment

NOTE If your child has a medical condition they can only attend the Holiday Program if the Action Plan, Risk Minimisation Plan and Communication have been completed and submitted prior to attendance. Any medication associated with the action plans must be brought to the program each day they attend. If medication is not supplied on the day, the child may not attend the program. This rule applies for all diagnosed medical conditions

All bookings are charged prior to attendance. This secures your child's spot in the Holiday Program. Staffing is based on attendance. If your child is sick or not attending a booked session, please call and notify the program before 8.30am. Please review the cancellation policy with regards to if a credit can be applied, as in some instances credit may not be able to be applied.

Age to attend

To qualify for enrolment in Windermere's Holiday Program children must be attending primary school (in that year).

Priority of access

Windermere's Holiday Program is offered to the general community.

Priority of Access will be given to:

- Children at risk of serious abuse or neglect and families in crisis.
- Children of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander
- Children attending the host school and other Windermere OSHC Schools
- 4. Children residing within the LGA.
